Sign language interpreter or note-takers for hearing impaired

In Lankaran State University, teachers of relevant departments for hearing impaired people have relevant knowledge of sign language translation in addition to their specialties. It is planned to create this service in the future in order to expand the educational opportunities of hearing-impaired students. The university administration says that they are working on various measures to ensure the support of students with special needs. Among them, the organization of sign language courses and the involvement of teaching staff who know sign language are also envisaged.

Lankaran State University attaches great importance to the principle of inclusive education and aims to implement various initiatives to ensure equal educational rights of students with special needs. The university plans to make improvements in this area for hearing impaired students.

To this end, management is considering taking various steps:

1. Sign Language Teaching: It is planned to organize sign language courses within the university. These courses are designed for both students and teaching staff, so it will be possible to better communicate with students with special needs.

2. Recruiting Professional Interpreters: In the future, efforts will be made to recruit specialized sign language interpreters to the university. This will improve the quality of lessons and ensure the full integration of hearing impaired students into education.

3. Adaptation of the infrastructure: It is planned to introduce special technological solutions in classrooms, seminar halls and other facilities to make the educational environment of the University more accessible.

4. Trainings and Awareness: Trainings will be organized for university staff to better understand and support students with special needs.

These initiatives are implemented not only for hearing impaired students, but in general to ensure the educational rights of all students with special needs and to make them active members of society. Lankaran State University intends to benefit from international experiences in this direction.
